


PROGRESS CUP AWARD

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Many of you may have seen media coverage regarding the importance of school attendance and the increase in penalty notice tariff.

Our school is working with the services of Education Welfare Advisory & Support Service Ltd who will be supporting us in monitoring attendance.

As a school, we want to support you but we will challenge and enforce irregular attendance without justifiable cause.

Please note, we will require medical evidence for absences of 5 days or more or where patterns of absences emerge. In addition, persistent lateness will be closely monitored and leaves of absence during term time will not be granted in accordance with government guidelines. If taken, a penalty notice will be served.



Recycle your Electrical Items in School

Join over 30 schools across East London to recycle unwanted electrical items. Bring anything with a plug, battery or cable to be recycled in the big pink bin currently at your school.

Search your drawers for old mobile phones, broken cables and devices or other electricals you no longer use. Items smaller than a microwave can be accepted in the pink bin, including batteries within items. Vapes, loose batteries or light bulbs can't go in the pink bin, but can be recycled in dedicated containers at a Reuse and Recycling Centre or your local collection point..



Did you know, electrical items wrongly placed in household bins can cause fires when crushed by bin lorries. Always put electrical items in a dedicated recycling container and never in any bin at home. To remove personal data from phones and other items use this online guide.

Broken electricals? Come to a <u>Repair Cafe</u> in the New Year. Full details online and more dates will be added across the year.



Barking Workhouse by Tamara Froud. A new project for 2025, funded by the Heritage of London Trust – aims to instal the original eighteenth-century signage from Barking Workhouse on Abbey Green and bring educational workhouse stories to life with pupils from St Margaret's Primary School and local youth groups.

WHAT are we doing?

- Barking Abbey's archaeology is the focus of a new
 heritage project: 'A magnifying glass on Barking
 Abbey's Archaeology better studied, shared &
 understood.' It is funded by *The National Lottery Heritage Fund* and managed by Be First on behalf of
 the borough. The project will culminate in a summer
 event sponsored by Weston Homes, whose Abbey
 Quay Office houses an exhibition on Barking's history &
 archaeological finds. The Abbey Archaeology event will
 take place both on Abbey Green and at Valence House
 Museum on the 26th and 27th July 2025. The project's
 exhibition will launch at the museum and an academic
 symposium will elevate the status of our abbey ruins.
- Public safety and infrastructure: We are protecting the safety of pedestrians by preventing drivers from crossing public realm to access parking on Back Lane new bollards have been installed, tree pits restored, and new trees planted. Changes to the Bus Stop on London Road have Scheduled Monument Consent and are funded by *Transport for London*.
- Conservation: Conservation Architects have been commissioned to survey and repair the ancient abbey walls and historic gravestones; works are due to begin Spring 2025.
- Updating our Management Agreement with Historic England and inform local people and park users of its significance and expectations for Abbey Green, which the borough manages on behalf of the nation.

A Steering Group for Abbey Green – WHY?

Abbey Green is an important public amenity and site of historic interest. It is largely comprised of *Barking Abbey Scheduled Monument*, it also incorporates two nationally listed buildings: St Margaret's Parish Church and the Curfew Tower; and two schools: St Joseph's RC Primary School and St Margaret's C of E Primary School. It is an Archaeological Priority Area and its historic importance within Barking is recognised through its designation as part of the Abbey and Barking Town Centre Conservation Area.

The steering group aims to: adopt a more intelligence-led approach to managing, maintaining, protecting, conserving, and improving Abbey Green. With clearly defined policies, procedures, roles and responsibilities across organisations and departments and with relevant stakeholders. It will be -promoting and adhering to the Management Agreement with Historic England, to preserve *Barking Abbey Scheduled Monument* on behalf of the nation, for future generations.
